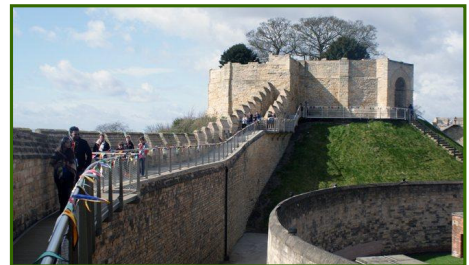


President Michéle writes:

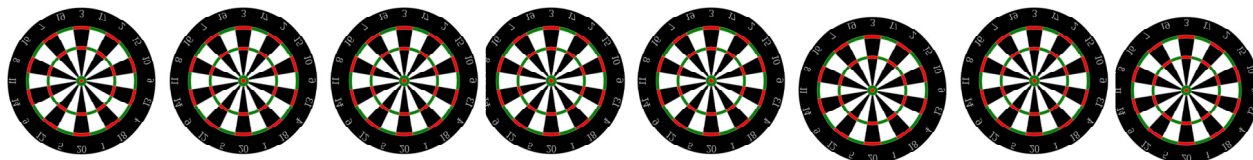
